

parents, and families helping families under the supervision of trained professionals. The main objectives of treatment are the revitalization of the family while enabling the young person to recapture a productive, meaningful, and drug free life.

STRAIGHT conducts parent and sibling sessions in addition to individual and family counseling. One result of the STRAIGHT program is that 92% of the brothers and sisters of young people who participate in the treatment program never become involved with drugs. STRAIGHT has intervened and educated these children while helping the child with the substance abuse problem. The best form of prevention is intervention.

STRAIGHT has received acclaim for the positive use of peer pressure in creating a drug free life style. Based on the premise



that it was peer pressure which first got the child involved with drugs, STRAIGHT uses supervised peer pressure to help young people get off and stay off drugs.

Although not an inpatient facility, STRAIGHT conducts an intense daily schedule of therapeutic sessions which includes the 12 Steps of Alcoholics Anonymous. STRAIGHT offers a program of intensive therapy and provides a structured format of progression where young people earn their way through the Five Phases of the treatment program.

THE FIVE PHASES

Young people progress through the following Five Phases or stages of the treatment cycle while participating in the STRAIGHT treatment program.

FIRST PHASE is the period immediately after the young person enters the program. They are working on self and developing honesty about past experiences using drugs, their thoughts, and feelings. The child lives with a host family who has a child in an advanced stage of the program.

SECOND PHASE is when the child comes home. They now live at home rather than with a host family and begin working on family relationships in addition to developing self.

THIRD PHASE focuses on achievement while continuing to work on family and self. The young person returns to the school or work environment and must face old friends and say no to the peer pressure to do drugs.

FOURTH PHASE is the time when the young person begins staged withdrawal from active involvement in the program. They are working on constructive use of leisure time, developing positive friendships, and engaging in recreational activities with family and friends.

FIFTH PHASE is the final phase when the young person has recaptured a well rounded drug free life style and concentrates on social responsibility and service to others.

Upon graduating from the Fifth Phase, the young people and their families have access to an aftercare program which will provide a safety net and sense of security for these young people as they pursue lives unimpeded by chemical dependency.

STRAIGHT shares this commitment to recovery from drug abuse with families all over America and is proud to be able to offer our substance abuse treatment program to others who refuse to let drug addiction continue its terrible control of their lives.
