## Today the race for office becomes official

NEW PORT RICHEY — The time has come to separate the men from the boys so to speak as the official qualifying period for political candidates begins at noon today.

This is the time when all those announced candidates for sheriif, County Commission, School Board, superintendent, circuit clerk, tax collector, property appraiser and supervisor of elections get their chance to become official candidates seeking the nomination of the various political parties to carry their standards in the November general election.

Two avenues are open for candidates to become official vote seekers, by paying a fee equal to 5 per cent of the annual salary of the office they seek or by submitting petitions signed by 5 per cent of registered voters in their party at the most recent general election.
